### Don't Drink and Drive.

Driving under the influence of alcohol is a criminal offence. Being found guilty of driving while above the legal drink-driving alcohol limit will result in punishment that could affect the rest of your life.

- Drink driving is a dangerous and punishable offence, which can seriously impact the safety of our roads and put other road users at risk.
- The offence can land drivers with a fine, or even a driving ban, which can have a negative impact on car insurance premiums.
- Units of alcohol can be hard to work out so opt for non alcoholic alternatives.
- To avoid getting caught out, we suggest drivers stop drinking early if you know you have to get behind the wheel in the morning, but the best advice would be to avoid drinking alcohol at all.
- If you really want to have a drink, assign a designated driver, book a taxi or use public transport

# Water Safety on our Coasts

- Choose a lifeguarded beach and only swim between the flags.
- Check the weather, tides, and be aware of rip currents.
- Be visible wear something bright!
- Do not swim if you are alone!
- Remember FLOAT TO LIVE!
- Carry your mobile phone in a waterproof pouch just incase!

## **Fire Safety Intervention**

Children and young people who have displayed fire setting behaviour or a fire fascination can receive free intervention from Herts Fire & Rescue.

If you are concerned about a child or young person that has a fascination with fire, you can refer to the scheme. We will accept referrals from parents / guardians or any concerned agency, however intervention can only take place with parental consent.

#### Signs of regular fire-setting:

- Small burn holes in carpets and / or furniture
- Charred paper in sinks or bins
- Matches or lighters hidden in bedrooms, school bag or coat
- An unusual fascination with fire
- · Unexplained fires in the home

#### Early intervention is key.

# Button batteries – risk of injury or death if swallowed - where are they?

#### **Everywhere!** Are they secure? Have a look at home:

- Watches, key fobs, torches, hearing aids
- Digital thermometers, bathroom scales, light-up water toys
- Wireless game controls, remote controls
- Flashing jewellery, clothing, shoes, toys, LED fairy/strip lights
- Flameless candles, tea lights, musical greetings cards

#### Children are most at risk from 1 to 4 years. Older children too.
